Can You Putt The Square Golf Ball?

The Square Golf Ball[®] is an interesting and frustrating item to put in the conventional sense. First, please know that the official policy is to never hit or strike The Square Golf Ball[®]. But in all honesty, a light tap with a putter generally results in no harm to either item. A video is available to view on this website. Use the "Videos" link in the main navigational area. Putting a cube with corners simply tosses out all logic on where The Square Golf Ball[®] will go. Occasionally, it will go somewhat straight as it bounces along. Generally it goes any direction except straight, and has been known to actually reverse course and come back at you! Is this important information? Not really, but in the event you ever found a need for a challenge, know that any player, regardless of golfing skills, will have the same disadvantage. Being a pro golfer will not give you an edge in this situation. So have fun – step off a 15 or 20 foot putt and see who can get nearest to the cup. Even with your own consistent swing, you're likely to have vastly different results each time. So if you think putting a traditional golf ball is difficult, you haven't seen anything until you try that putt with The Square Golf Ball[®]. Please remember – a putter and a driver have extremely different force attributes. If you use a driver on The Square Golf Ball®, plan for it to be the end of The Square Golf Ball[®] as you know it, then start looking for all the pieces. Plus, who knows what damage you may incur with the driver itself, and maybe even your elbow as the vibration shoots up the shaft. Play it safe, restrain yourself to a putt if you simply must hit The Square Golf Ball® with a club.
