Is The Imprint Ink Toxic?

The Square Golf Ball® is imprinted with or using multiple colors, as well as a clear gloss finish. According to the ink manufacturer, which is mandated to provide specifics about their ink because it is sometimes used on toys, the ink(s) used are non-toxic in every sense. The application method used during production makes the imprint and clear finish virtually indestructible to begin with. So even if you chewed on or sucked on The Square Golf Ball®, and even if you somehow were able to dislodge a piece of imprint, it would do you no harm. We again highly advise you not attempt to prove this right or wrong, but if it makes you feel safer that The Square Golf Ball® imprinting is non-toxic, then rest at ease. The Square Golf Ball® is as similar to a traditional golf ball in every fashion. The outer skin is made from poly urethane, which most golf balls are made from. A second material called Surlyn is also used by some manufacturers. The Square Golf Ball® has the same dimples as a traditional golf ball, although because there is physically more surface area, there are more dimples. The diameter of The Square Golf Ball® is the same as a traditional golf ball. The inner core of The Square Golf Ball® has no bearing on performance, so the core is substantially different, yet the perceived weight of The Square Golf Ball® is that of a traditional golf ball. Every aspect of a traditional golf ball was considered and factored in when designing The Square Golf Ball®. And it shows.
