Square Golf Ball Dice

The Square Golf Ball[®] dice. Could happen. We've never imprinted The Square Golf Ball[®] in this manner, although we have numbered a set of four with unique numbers, supposedly for use in putting competitions. Using The Square Golf Ball[®] as a dice cube would certainly work, but when rolling two dice, you would almost certainly require both hands. Or maybe go really wild and imprint 8-14 with a different letter of the alphabet using all six sides. 10 Square Golf Balls® would afford 60 different letters, with vowels and selected letters used more than once. Then roll to create the biggest word – just an idea. Or maybe just roll one at a time, and spell a real word in the fewest cubes. Roll an "A" and you've got a word, or "I", etc. No same words allowed. Keep track and keep score – like in golf, the person with the lowest score at the end of however many turns you decide on, wins. The same basic idea could be used with images – a rose, a sun, a tree, etc – then play sort of like Yahtzee[®]. The important and interesting fact here is that you get to decide what you want on the cube faces. Sort let your imagination run wild – create a fun game idea, and let us assist by making your game pieces. You make the rules, and together, everyone has a good time.
